A Year in Review



The New Iceland Heritage museum is one of seven Signature Museums. Open 12 months of the year, we welcome visitors from 10–4 daily. During the summer months we are able to do this with the help of summer students. Winter months we rely on volunteers to help staff our museum.

During the summer months (May – Sept) we manage the Lake Winnipeg Visitor Centre and open the doors to visitors to see our permanent exhibits that the tell the story of the relationship with the lake and fishing on Lake Winnipeg. We finished the last phase of a new interactive exhibit educating about the health of and the watershed of Lake Winnipeg Watershed.

We host programs and events that are of interest to our members, visitors and community members. Special events and cosponsoring of events is also a part of our being an active community partner.

We work with community groups such as the Gimli Heritage Advisory Committee, Gimli Ice Fest, Community Development Corporation, RM of Gimli, Gimli Chamber of Commerce.

The museum has a temporary gallery, in which allows us to host exhibits from other museums, Manitoba Arts Network and artists. It also allows us to showcase some of our artifacts that are not part of the permanent display.






Collections



The NIHM Collections committee fielded over 20 offers of artifact and book donations, accepting a variety of items that fit within our accessions policy.

We assisted twice with a research group from the Department of Linguistics, from the University of Konstanz in Germany. This group needed to gather individuals who spoke Icelandic here in the Interlake, as we are the largest group of Icelanders outside of Iceland. Identifying, contacting and scheduling the interviews with the individuals was our part of this process. The researchers came in the fall and then again early in 2024.

There were 8 research requests and there were 3 photo requests.















Recognition



NIHM recognizes the sustainable support instituted by the Province of Manitoba in 2020, with the establishment of the Signature Museums Endowment Fund in partnership with the Winnipeg Foundation and the community foundations served by Endow Manitoba. NIHM acknowledges support from two federal programs that provided stability during the uncertain times: the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy and the Recovery Fund for Heritage Organizations. NIHM also recognizes the continued support of the RM of Gimli whose annual contribution supports a portion of the museum's operations.

- In 2020, the Province of 'Manitoba established the New Iceland Heritage Museum Inc. Signature Museum Sustainability Fund with the Westshore Community Foundation. Income from this endowment fund will generate revenue for the NIHM on annual basis in perpetuity. These funds are allocated towards three priority areas.
 - <u>Governance and Management</u> Expenses: Funds are used to secure Audit Services, strategic planning
 - <u>Museums Standards Eligible Expenses</u>: Collections expenses and workshop hosting
 - <u>Visitor Experience</u>: Installment of new interactive exhibit at the Lake Winnipeg Visitor Centre
- The Westshore Community Foundation is also home to the New Iceland Heritage Fund an endowment established through the Manitoba Heritage Trust Program. In 2020, the NIHM concluded a successful fundraising campaign to build this endowment.
